

COMPARATIVE HUMAN DEVELOPMENT COURSES

There are a total of twelve courses that a Comparative Human Development graduate student must take in order to have a degree conferred. We presume that students will take other courses relevant to their chosen course of study.

Terms:

Required (R)- This course must be taken by every Comparative Human Development Graduate Student

Distribution- Students need to take at least one qualified course in each of the 5 Graduate areas

Specialization- Students must take two additional courses in one of the 5 areas in which they wish to focus their studies

Every graduate student must to take the following courses for a quality¹ grade:

1. HD Concepts (Required, R).
2. Six HD distribution area courses, one in each of the following areas:
 - 1) Comparative Behavioral Biology
 - 2) Society, Institutions, Culture and the Life Course
 - 3) Cultural Psychology, Psychological Anthropology, Immigration Studies
 - 4) Health, Vulnerability and Culture
 - 5) Language and Communication in Thought and Interaction
 - M) Methods in Human Development Research

(SOCI 40112, 30005, 30111 30112, 30206, 30157, 40103 have been offered in past years and have fulfilled this requirement)

Courses may be listed in more than one area, but they cannot fill more than one requirement.

3. Intermediate Statistics from among the following:

4. Two trial research seminars (Required, R).
5. Two additional HD courses in the area of specialization.

Both classes with and without an asterisk () can be taken to fulfill the specialization requirement.*

Total Number of required courses: 12

Students do not need to complete all these requirements by the end of their second year. However, they must have five quality grades by the spring of their first year, and ten quality grades by the end of the second year. On average a graduate student should take at least two courses for quality grades in each quarter of their first two years.

Students may always petition the Curriculum Committee to request a course be considered for meeting requirements.

¹ A “quality” grade is defined as a “letter” grade, B or better. “Pass/Fail” or “Registered” do not count as a quality grade. HD 40100 is a Pass/Fail class and does not need to be taken for a quality grade.

Required course schedule for 1st and 2nd years Graduate Students.

1. First year students are not allowed to take any reading class.
2. Each student is required to take a minimum of 3 classes per quarter until all requirements are fulfilled to maintain full-time status; more courses can be taken in each quarter to finish most requirements within the first year, if desired.
3. It is strongly recommended to finish all the requirements by the end of the second year; nevertheless, due to class availability students may be allowed to fulfill their requirements pass their second year.
